8002-Golden Wax Bush Bean

A prolific variety with smooth, slightly curved, clear, light yellow pods 12-15cm long on medium size, vigorous plants. Good disease resistance. Ideally suited to northern climates. Black seed/white eye. 50days

8004-Green bean Tendergreen

Productive variety with round flecked pods, 15cm. straight, string less and tender pods are set well off the ground for easier picking. Excellent resistance to mosaic. Mottled seed. Matures in 45 days

8006-Beet-Early Wonder Tall Top

Semi-globe shape, smooth skinned, very solid flesh with unsurpassed uniformity and interior quality. Very sweet and tender. 57days

8010-Broccoli Green Sprouting

A traditional variety and a reliable producer of compact, light green plants with bluish green central heads averaging 15-20 across. Vitamin rich. 70 day maturity.

8012-Carrot Nantes (Heirloom)

Introduced to North American gardeners in 1870. Dark orange-red variety with cylindrical shape and 15-17cm length. Great tasting, tender and coreless. Vigorous and early maturing at 70 days.

8014-Corn Luscious

Its name says it all... a great tasting Tablesweet® corn producing 20cm (8") ears and 16-18 rows of plump, sweet and tender bi-coloured kernels. Excellent tip fill, easy to pick and great disease resistance. 85 days

8016-Cucumber Muncher

Smooth, medium green, burpless fruits, 25 x 8cm. size with a crisp, non-bitter taste. Incredibly productive and disease tolerant. 75 days

8030-Herb Sweet Basil

The undisputed "King of Herbs" useful for flavouring soups, stews, poultry and sauces. Annual. Height 60cm. Matures in 85 days.

8022-Herb Cilantro

White seeds are used in confections, cookies, poultry stuffing; young leaves are great in salads. Grows 60cm. high in 70 days.

8020-Herb Chives

Mild onion flavour is irresistible in salads or as a garnish. Perennial. 65 days.

8010-8024-Herb Dill

Both the finely cut foliage and seeds are useful for flavouring pickles, vinegar, fish and salads, etc. Grow to 75-90 cm. height Annual. 70 days

8026-Herb Oregano

Well known as an Italian favourite. Strong aromatic leaves are used in spaghetti, salads etc. Grows to 60 cm. height. Perennial. 90 days

8000-Herb Arugula

Also known as Rocket, this annual herb is a strong tasting spinach-like green with a delicious nutty flavour popular in salads or cooked like spinach. 75 days

8034-Herb Thyme

Compliments the flavour of all meat and fish dishes, stews, vegetables and more. Attractive to honeybees too. Height 15-30cm. Perennial. Maturity-85 days.

8036-Lettuce Black seeded Simpson (heirloom)

Introduced in 1875. Extra large, crumpled, light green leaves. Well-suited to early crops and cold frame sowing. 45 days

8038-Lettuce Buttercrunch

Butterhead type with dark green, thick blistered, juicy, crispy leaves and a large yellow-white heart. As delicious as its name suggests. Long lasting, tolerant to boiling. 65 days.

8040-Lettuce Marveille Four

Known commonly as Marvel of the Four Seasons, this butterhead heritage variety forms 20-30cm heads. The crisp creamy yellows to green leaves often have a red fringe making this a beautiful looking lettuce. 50 days

8046-Melon Heart of Gold

Developed in the early 1900's. Aromatic, sweet, deep orange flesh. Thick and firm cavity, nearly round shape with 14-16cm. diameter. Weights 1.5-2 kg; heavily netted, medium ribs. Blight tolerant. 75 days

8048-Onion Evergreen Bunching

Mild, sweet, green onions for any cuisine that matures quickly from seed. Successive sowing will provide onions season-long. 65 days

8050-Parsley Moss Curled

Dark green leaves, finely cut, crimped and curled. Broader leaves are more flavourful than plain leaf types. Best for garnishing. 70 days

8054-Pea Oregon Sugar Pod

Light green 10 cm by 1.7 cm flat pods which are very sweet and succulent right off the vine. Usually produces two pods per cluster. Plants grow 40-70cm. tall and don't need to be staked. Excellent disease resistance. 60 days

8052-Pea Laxton Progress

(Heirloom)
Vigorous plants are loaded with 12cm pods each bursting with 8-10 extra sweet, soft skinned peas. Plants are extra early maturing and do very well in short season growing areas. 62 days.

8056-Pepper California Wonder

Large, thick walled 4 lobed fruits 11 cm long by 7-10cm diameter and 130g weight. Very Mild and sweet, glossy green fruits will turn bright red if left to mature on the plants. Maturity 75 days.

8058-Pepper Long Red Cayenne Slim

Long, slender, wrinkled peppers averaging 12.5 cm by 12.5cm size with a tapered end. Often curled and twisted. Green fruits ripen to a crimson red. 70 days.

8060-Pumpkin Big Max

Large, exhibition size pumpkins weigh up to 45kg in size: think, slight red-orange skin with bright yellow-orange flesh. 120 days.

8062-Pumpkin Small Sugar (Heirloom)

Described as early as 1863, this may have originated with the American Indians but was more likely selected out of Connecticut Fields in the early to mid 1800's. Round fruits 20-25cm diameter with a sweet, meaty fine grained,

bright orange flesh that's great for pies. Maturity 108 days.

8064Radish Cherry Belle

Very sweet and mild with a solid and crisp flesh. Retains its excellent eating quality over a long period. Matures in 25-30 days.

8066-Radish French Breakfast

This heritage variety has rich scarlet roots with white tips. The roots are crisp, mild and surprisingly sweet. Radishes take very little room to grow and can be planted to mature during any cool season. They are often used as row markers for slower germinating vegetables. 23 days

8068-Spinach Bloomsdale (Heirloom)

Bred in 1925 it is still the most popular variety sold today! Thick, twisted, glossy green leaves. Heavy yielding, heat and cold tolerant; slow bolting. Sow late fall or early spring. Matures in 47 days.

8072-Squash Dark Green Zucchini

Compact, bushy plants produce delicious 30-75cm fruits. Pick when small for best flavour. Large fruits are great used for breads or muffin recipes. 50 days.

8070-Squash Burgess Buttercup

Small fruits with thick orange very sweet and dry flesh. Green with narrow grey stripes and slight mottling. Maturity 87 days.

8080-Tomato Sweetie

Small, very sweet cherry size 2-3cm fruits and hundreds of them on these aggressive vine-like plants. Requires staking.

8078-Tomato Brandywine (Heirloom)

An Amish Heirloom from 1895 and perhaps the best tasting tomato you'll ever eat! Deeply lobed beefsteak type fruits. Purplish red fruits of 250g to 300g size. Potato-like leaves. Matures in 80 days from transplant.
